





# Inmates learn life skills to re-enter community

The Department of Corrections celebrated the first-ever graduating class from its Fu'una Rising group program Thursday at the Corrections facility in Mangilao.

Fu'una Rising, named in honor of the CHamoru goddess of creation, is focused on providing support and "soft-skill development" including anger management, stress management and other fundamental skills critical to qualified inmates' successful re-entry into the island community.

Several women-owned small businesses in construction have teamed with the Guam chapter of the National Association of Women in Construction and the Guam DOC to raise funds and provide services for the female inmates. First lady Christine Calvo is the program's honorary adviser.
